Notice to Employees--Injuries Caused By Work

You may be entitled to workers' compensation benefits if you are thor become ill because of your job. Workers' compensation coversmost work-related physical or mental injuries and illnesses. An injury or illness can be caused by one event (such aurhurting your wrist from doing the same motion over and over).

Benefits. Workers' compensation benefits include:

- x Medical Care: Doctor visits, hospital services, physical therapy, lab tests, x-rays, medicines, medical equipment and travel costs to are reasonably necessary to treat ȳnjury. You should never see a bill. There are limits on chiropractic, physical therapy and occupational therapy visits.
- x Temporary Disability (TD) Benefits: Payments if you lose wages while recovering. For most injuries, TD benefits may not be paid formore than 104 weeks within five years from the date of injury.
- x Permanent Disability (PD) Benefits:Payments if you do not recover completely and your injury causes a permanent loss of physical comental function that a doctor can measure.
- x Supplemental Job Displacement Benefit: A nontransferable voucher, if you are injured on or after 1/1/2004, your injury causes permanent disability, and your employer does not offer you regular, modified, or alternative work.
- x Death Benefits:Paid to your dependents if you die from a work-related injury or illness.

Naming Your Own Physician Before Injury or Illness (Predesignation). You may be able to choose the doctor who will treat you for a job injury or illness. If eligible, you must tell your employer, in woutime
