14.0 INTRODUCTION

Federaland state regulations require that students receiving financial aid be enrolled as a regular student in a financial aid eligible program. An eligible program is one that leads to an associate or bachelor's degree of average ar program leading to a vocational certificate, or a specialized program that meets federal criteria. Continued eligibility requires meeting the criteria for Satisfactory Academic Progress (**SAP**) he responsibility of all financial aid recipients to understand the terms and conditions of the Napa Valley College (NVC) Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy in order to maintain their eligibility to receive Marking SAP means meeting all the standards and requirements of this policy.

14.1 STANDARDS

STANDARD#1: QUALITATIVESPA

Studentsare required to maintain a 2.0 minimum cumulative GPA The GPA will include allaided and unaided terms at NVC.

STANDARD#2: QUANTITATIVEPACE

Minimum PACE at NVC is 67% of all cumulative units attemptedCE is the rate at which a student completes requirements for their educational goal and is calculated by dividing the number of cumulative units attempted eginning with Spring 2024 medial and ESL units do not count when calculating Pace for SAP

To measure whether students are progressing on pace for completion of their course of study within the maximum time frame, NVC evaluates the pace rate of financial aid students at the end of each term. At each term's end, students are expected to have completed at least 67% of **al** uni eliminated from the GPA calculation through the previously attended will count as both units attempted at the previously attended will count attended will count as both units attended will count as both units

All financialaid students are expected to complete their program of study within 150% of the program. Students enrolled in 600 it AA/AS, 4/ear transfer, or vocational program.

14.2 SAPEVALUATION

SARwill be evaluated at the end of each semester. The number of units a student attempts and completes will be used to calculate SAP status. Clock hour programs are evaluated at the end of each payment period.

A. SATISFACTORY

SATISFACTOR the status assigned o a student in good standing who is making SAP and is not subject to disqualification.

B. WARNING

WARNING is the status assigned to a satisfactory student who fails to make SAP. A student on WARNING status may continue to receive aid for one semester only. WARNING status does not require an applear student action. In addition, students who havenever applied for financialaid will be placed on Warning if their cumulative GPA is below 2.0 and/or if their cumulative PACE rate is below 67% at the time they enter the Financial Aid program.

At the end of the WARNING semester, a student is required to meet SAP standards. Students who have failed to make
